NATIVE PERENNIALS

Vervain, Hoary

Verbena stricta



This native perennial grows up to 3 feet. Drought resistant and non-aggressive. Self-seeds easily but does not compete well with more aggressive plants. The blue-purple spikes last for 4-6 weeks from June-September. The leaves are a host for the Common Buckeye Butterfly while the nectar is a source for butterflies. The seeds feed small birds and mammals.

Plant 10-12 inches apart. Full sun to part shade. Prefers dry to medium, well drained loamy soils.
